ORDINANCE NO. 008/2012

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MONROE, WASHINGTON, AMENDING THE PARK CODE, MONROE MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 9.28; AUTHORIZING THE LIMITED POSSESSION AND CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN CITY PARKS THROUGH AN APPROVED SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT AND APPROPRIATE STATE OF WASHINGTON APPROVAL; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Parks and Recreation Director has recommended to the City Council that the following amendment be made to the Monroe Park Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has a goal to enhance and increase economic development through special events and use of recreational lands to create new revenues; and

WHEREAS, authorizing the limited consumption and possession of alcoholic beverages in City parks, subject to a Special Event Permit, will advance said goals while still ensuring the safe and orderly use of City parks;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONROE, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN as follows:

Section 1. Amendment of MMC 9.28.210. Section 9.28.210 of the Monroe Municipal Code is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

9.28.210 Alcoholic beverages.

It is unlawful for any person to consume or possess any alcoholic beverage in a city park, including unopened alcoholic beverage containers, except in those areas and/or at those events for which the appropriate license(s)/permit(s) has been obtained from the State of Washington and an approved Special Event Permit has been issued by the director or designee in accordance with Chapter 5.28 MMC.

<u>Section 2.</u> <u>Severability</u>. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance.

Section 3. <u>Effective Date</u>. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect thirty (30) days from and after its passage and approval as required by law.
